- ☐ Essay. Describe your past volunteer work in conservation or environmental improvement and its relevance to your likely career in science.
Must be on a separate page, single spaced, one-page maximum.
- ☐ A letter of recommendation from **one** of the following: guidance counselor, teacher, coach or employer.
